What is Open eGov?

- Software that runs our web site
- Could also run your web site
 - No cost or obligation
- 1. community and 2. technology
- Common solution to a common need
- Win for:
 - You: high quality, free software
 - Us: we benefit from your participation
 - Vendors: provide leveraged services
 - Citizens: low cost, high quality service with consistency

Web CMS for government

- Internet
 - Full complement of integrated software tools
 - Entire knowledge base, docs, training, ++
- Intranet
 - Governance and transparency tools
 - Project Proposal System
 - Project Portfolio Manager
- Sharing all the above as:
 - Free download
 - Providing services and support (optional)

Selling?

- No, but building community
- Enabling the reuse
- Fair and equitable terms
- No cost or any obligation if “reuse only”
- Otherwise, cost sharing model

Examples of Reuse

- Cities of Staunton and Waynesboro, VA
 - Downloaded software + documentation
 - Intranet first
 - No cost (tech person)
- Franklin County, VA
 - Internet site hosted at NN
 - Costs
 - \$4,000 acquisition (training + custom service)
 - \$260/mo hosting services
- City of Sambersville, Belgium uses our Project Portfolio Manager, we use their Agenda Management System
